

St. Michael's Hospital and the Department of Surgery in the Faculty of Medicine, University of Toronto is accepting applications from neurosurgeons with interest in trauma, neuro-oncology, neurocritical care and/or spinal neurosurgery.

The Division of Neurosurgery of St. Michael's Hospital/University of Toronto, is a large academic neurosurgery unit with fully appointed clinical facilities, a large dedicated neurotrauma intensive care unit, and new experimental and clinical research facilities. The Division of St. Michael's hospital focuses on neurovascular disease, neuro-oncology, neurotrauma and critical care.

The successful applicant will fulfill the criteria for clinician-scientist. Responsibilities will include patient care, teaching, trainee supervision and research that is aligned with the goals of the Keenan Research Centre and Li Ka Shing Knowledge Institute of St. Michael's Hospital. The recruit is anticipated to have a strong biomedical engineering background and to conduct basic, translational and/or clinical research in this area. Facilitation of collaborations between engineering and members of the Division of neurosurgery and of the Keenan Research Centre is important.

Qualifications include an MD, specialist certification in neurosurgery and eligibility for licensure in the Province of Ontario. A postgraduate degree (MSc or PhD) in basic or clinical research and fellowship training in a neurosurgery subspecialty are desirable. Candidates must have or be eligible for certification by The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

Salary and rank will be commensurate to qualifications and experience. Date of start of appointment will be determined based on candidate availability at St. Michael's Hospital requirements.
